## Outlook for 2009 Meeting

Team USA selected itself from the recent 90<sup>th</sup> USA national championships in Eugene, Oregon. Spots were offered to athletes who placed 4<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>. Coaches added two discretionary selections. Team USA is deep, with a mixture of veterans and youngsters.

The team will be led by Chris Randolph, 25, a former 2x NCAA D-II champion from Seattle Pacific University, who was fourth at the USA Senior championships. Two return from the 2008 team which won in Manhattan, Kansas, averaging over 8000 points for the official 5 man score. Joe Detmer, Lodi, Wisconsin was 5<sup>th</sup> in 2008. Lysias Edmonds, Phoenix, AZ, dnf'd last year. Gone from the '08 club are the trio of 8100+ performers: Jake Arnold (2<sup>nd</sup>-8191 points) has moved up to the '09 IAAF World championship team; Mustafa Abdur-Rahim (3<sup>rd</sup>-8175 points) and Chris Helwick (4<sup>th</sup>-8143 points), both of whom suffered season ending injuries (shoulder, back respectively)

Added to team USA are a pair of former Olympians who are recovering from season long injuries. Three time Olympian Tom Pappas, 32, and '04 Olympian Paul Terek, 29, join Team USA. Terek was 5<sup>th</sup> at the USA championships. Pappas has yet to compete in '09. Both bring a wealth of experience to this annual affair. Pappas won the meet in 2002 and Terek was 5<sup>th</sup> in 2006.

Missouri junior Nick Adcock, 21, and 3xNAIA All-American Mike Marsh, 29, round out the American club. The USA coaching staff includes former world class decathlete Mario Sategna, the b9997 winner and an assistant coach at the University of Texas, and Travis Geopfert, the head coach at the University of Iowa, himself a two-time team USA participant.

Germany's Team Zehnkampf, like TeamUSA, will send it top three to the IAAF World Championships in Berlin. Their remaining team is youthful and talented, led '06 World University Games champion Jacob Minah, veteran Lars Albert, in his 5<sup>th</sup> Thorpe Cup appearance, and Jan Felix Knobel, last year's IAAF world junior champion. For the fourth time ever the German federation did not send a decathlon foursome to the European Cup (in late June) deciding to focus on the USA team dual instead.

There is no way to forecast the outcome of this meet. There are three reasons why the host German team will be favored:

- youth (the German team averages 22 years of age-young legs);
- given their seasonal best performances they out-score the American team by more than 400 points;
- they are at home.

There are four reasons why team USA will be favored:

- experience (Team USA averages 26+ years of age and collectively have competed in 36 international decathlons)
- Using career best scores Team USA, on paper, appears superior.
- History: Team USA has on 12 of the 15 previous meetings including the last six.
- Tom Pappas.

Nothing is ever taken for granted at the Thorpe Cup and it is always hotly contested. In 1999 the meet was decided by a miniscule, microscopic, tiny, infinitesimal, atomic...(you get the picture!) five points. One German coach described the margin as "a puff of wind." It was the closest team match in decathlon history. The 2006 winning USA margin in Manhattan was a mere just 57 points. Team USA has also lost by the biggest margin in series history, 2614 points in 2001. USA teams have won 12 of the first 15 meets in the current series which dates to the 1993 "Shellacken in Aachen." The American team has a current 6 meet win streak.

## Thorpe Cup History

**Now the world's most important nation vs. nation team decathlon**, this meet has been variously called the VISA CUP Meet or the JEEP Challenge. And in 2007 officially took the name of The Thorpe Cup in honor of 1912 Olympic Decathlon Champion Jim Thorpe, Carlisle, PA

The concept of an annual team match was initially conceived by VISA-USA team coach Harry Marra and Team Zehnkampf coach Claus Marek in 1993. This is the 16th of a series of annual international team decathlons between the USA and Germany. In the current series, the first meeting was arranged in Aachen, Germany in 1993 where Stefan Schmid of Germany and the VISA USA team were victorious. The American team won 6 of the initial 7 team battles. One, the 1999 affair, also in Aachen was decided by a mere 5 points. Team USA got back on the winning side in 2002 with a major win in Walnut, CA ,led by Tom Pappas and repeated in 2003 in Bernhausen. The 2004 meet, scheduled for Kansas State U, was cancelled by the German federation in June, 2004. The US won the 2005 meeting in Bernhausen, the 2006 meeting at Kansas State University in Manhattan, a return affair in Bernhausen and last year's major win in Manhattan where the American squad, for only the 2<sup>nd</sup> time in history,

averaged over 8000 pts per man (team: Arnold, Abdur-Rahim, Helwick, Detmer, Boyles)

Last year's champion, Norman Müller, will not defend since he is schedule to represent the host nation at the IAAF world championships in Berlin.

In 1996, with the meet in Edwardsville, IL, the USA squad set a world 5 man team record averaging 8121.4 points per man.

Only Kip Janvrin and Mike Maczey have won the individual title more than once. See below. Janvrin won in 1996 with a meet record 8462 and again in 2000. He has also placed 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> twice.

In the years before the current series, USA and German decathlon teams met twice. Team USA won both, with Bruce Jenner getting a world leading score in 1974 in Tallinn, Estonia (tri meet: USA/USSR/ Germany). Team USA won again in 1983 in Baton Rouge, LA. So, counting the two earlier team meetings, the Americans hold a historical 14-3 national team advantage.

**Head Men's Coach: Mario Sategna University of Texas**

In his sixth season with the Texas men's track and field program, assistant coach Mario Sategna provides the coaching expertise that has helped keep the Longhorns' program on the national stage. Sategna, who is considered one of the most outstanding combined and field event coaches in the nation, as he helped freshman Maston Wallace win the NCAA Championship in the pole vault and mentored two former Longhorns, Andra Manson (high jump) and Trey Hardee (decathlon), to berths on the United States squad for the 2008 Beijing Olympics.



Since joining the staff at the start of the 2003-04 season, Sategna has coached four Horns to seven NCAA Championships and eight student-athletes to 23 All-America honors. He has also steered the Horns to a third-place outdoor finish in 2006 and a fourth-place in '08. Sategna's athletes helped UT sweep the 2006 Big 12 Conference indoor and outdoor crowns, a share of the 2007 indoor league title and the 2008 league championship.

The 2006 USTFCCCA National Assistant Coach of the Year for men's jumps and combined events was instrumental in the individual careers of Hardee, the collegiate record holder in the heptathlon and decathlon, Donovan Kilmartin, the only three-time NCAA Heptathlon Champion.

Under Sategna's tutelage, Hardee placed second in the decathlon at the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials with 8,534 points to make the Olympic team. In Beijing, Hardee sat in third-place after the first day before withdrawing mid-way through the

In his first year with the Longhorns, Sategna produced two NCAA indoor champions (Manson and Kilmartin). Sategna came to Texas from the University of Minnesota where he was the men's assistant coach for four years (1999-02). In that position, he was in charge of the Gophers' throws, multi-events, pole vault and high hurdler events. He coached student-athletes to four Big 10 individual crowns, two All-America honors and eight school records. Sategna also helped guide Minnesota to the Big 10 Conference Outdoor title, a first-place finish in the USTCA Indoor Team Power Rankings and Top 10 showings at the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Championships during the 2003 campaign.

Before his tenure at Minnesota, Sategna served as an assistant coach in charge of throws at Wichita State from 1998-99. Prior to his stint with the Shockers, Sategna was a physical education teacher and track and field coach at Albuquerque (N.M.) Academy in 1997-98 and a volunteer assistant track and field coach at LSU in 1996-97. A standout decathlete, Sategna was a three-time All-American at LSU in the 1990s. He won the 1994

Southeastern Conference title and the 1995 NCAA crown in the decathlon, and his personal-best point total of 8,172 still stands as the LSU record and ranks among the NCAA top 10 all-time point totals. He also finished sixth in the World University Games, was a 1996 United States Olympic Trials qualifier and won the 1997 U.S. versus Germany Decathlon Dual meet (8,107).

**Assistant Men’s Coach: Travis Geopfert University of Northern Iowa**

Travis Geopfert was named the head track and field/cross country coach at the University of Northern Iowa on July 3, 2008. "Travis has proven himself an exceptional coach and outstanding recruiter during his five years at UNI, and he has demonstrated an ability to enhance the experience of our student-athletes both on and off the track," UNI Director of Athletics Troy Dannen said. ". Geopfert, who was an All-American and a 2002 graduate of UNI, has been a Panther assistant coach for the past five seasons where he oversaw the jumpers and multi-event student-athletes. He was promoted to associate head coach following the 2007 season. In 2008, Geopfert was named the United States Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association Midwest Region men's assistant coach of the year.



Geopfert replaced Chris Bucknam who recently accepted the head men's track and field/cross country job at the University of Arkansas. In 2008 at the NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships, UNI was the only school in the country to qualify two athletes apiece for each of the multi-event competitions. Raven Cepeda and Mat Clark each earned All-America honors in the men's heptathlon, while sophomore Dani Stipe and freshman Olimpia Nowak both competed in the women's pentathlon. At the 2008 NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships, Geopfert coached three individuals to All-America honors.

In Geopfert's first six seasons as a coach - including a year as an assistant at the University of Central Missouri - his athletes have produced 74 all-conference awards, 34 conference championships and 19 All-America citations in addition to a pair of national championships. Geopfert's athletes also hold 11 current UNI school records. As a Panther, Geopfert was a three-time MVC champion, claiming titles in the 1999 4x100 meter relay, the 1998 decathlon, and the 2000 distance medley that went on to the NCAA Championships, earning All-America honors. In 2006, he won the Drake Relays decathlon and placed sixth at the U.S. Championships. He also earned a spot on the USA vs. Germany decathlon team for the fourth time. He was the 2004 Drake Relays decathlon champion, defeating Olympian and mentor Kip Janvrin. Geopfert finished 11th at the 2004 U.S. Olympic Trials in the decathlon, and was third at the 2003 U.S. vs. Germany decathlon dual in Stuttgart, Germany. His personal best in the decathlon is 7,785 points.

Prior to his return to UNI, Geopfert served as assistant track and field coach at Central Missouri. During the 2003 indoor season, Geopfert's athletes scored 25 points at the NCAA national meet, including national titles in the high jump and triple jump. Originally from Panora, Iowa, Geopfert earned his bachelor's degree from UNI in 2002. He is currently finishing his master's degree in coaching. He and his wife, Nicole, a first-grade teacher at Price Laboratory School, reside in Cedar Falls.

Made 3<sup>rd</sup> (a record) US Olympic team I 2008 with 3<sup>rd</sup> at US Trials (8511). Won the previous two USA national titles (2006-07) and has won a record tying 5 title overall.

Injuries have bedeviled the 2003 IAAF world champ. A ruptured plantar fascia in his left foot felled him in Athens in 2004. The foot healed by early 2005 and he resumed training when his left shoulder gave him trouble. He had an operation which effectively wiped out the 2005 season. An MRI revealed further problems in mid-2005 (torn labrum) and another operation was necessary. In 2005 Tom married heptathlete Kim Schiennz in 2005 and they welcomed a daughter in 2006. Put ten workmanlike marks up at USATF champs and came away with 4<sup>th</sup> national crown in 2006.

Tom had shoulder surgery in early 2004, conducted a modest indoor season, then opened the outdoor campaign with a 8732 effort (2<sup>nd</sup>) place at Gotzis, Austria, 110 down on Roman Sebrle. His 2<sup>nd</sup> day in Gotzis was a lifetime best and included a PR 13.90 hurdles. He then made a second U.S. Olympic team with an 8517 effort in Sacramento behind Bryan Clay. His left foot problems surfaced in Athens ruining any Olympic medal chance.

Tom won the IAAF World indoor heptathlon in Birmingham, UK in March, 2003 then opened outdoor season with PR 2<sup>nd</sup> place finish at Gotzis, 8585. He followed with a huge PR 8784 win at the USA nationals in Palo Alto to become the #2 scoring American ever (behind Dan O'Brien). In the 2003 Nationals Tom became the first man in history to jump over 26 feet (long jump), over 7-0 (high jump) and over 17-0 (Pole vault) in the same meet. He then captured the IAAF outdoor world championships in Paris becoming the first decathlete to win indoor and outdoor world titles in the same season. He also won the IAAF Combined Events Challenge for 2004.

2002 was a super season for Pappas as he won 3 of four major meets (USA nationals-his 2<sup>nd</sup> title), USA vs Germany and DecaStar in Talence, France. His only loss was an opening season meet to world record holder Roman Sebrle in Gotzis. He turned the table on the world's lone 9K man at the end of the season in France. For his efforts he was ranked #2 in the world. Tom also achieved a bit of notoriety in 2002 by becoming the first to win both USA indoor and outdoor titles in the same season and, at Gotzis, became the first decathlete in history to jump 25-0, 7-0 and 17-0 in the three jumps.



In his freshman year at Lane Community College the lanky Pappas won the national and Pan-Am junior titles. He repeated as conference champ a year later, then transferred to the University of Tennessee. Coached by Bill Webb, he filled out and won the SEC crown in '97 but an injury relegated him to 8<sup>th</sup> at the NCAA meet. Tom red-shirted in 1998 in favor of knee surgery. As a Volunteer senior he opened eyes indoors then posted a collegiate record (8463) at the opening outdoor meet getting 8 PRs impressing both Dan O'Brien and Daley Thompson. A heel bruise slowed Tom yet he had little problem winning the NCAAs (8184) and finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> at USATF (8187).

2000 saw Tom win the US Olympic Trials with a PR 8467 then finished a solid 5<sup>th</sup> at the Sydney Olympic Games, beating both world record holder Thomas Dvorak/CZE and Atlanta silver medalist Frank Busemann/GER. Shoulder operation in early, 2001, only competed in first 7 events at USA nationals. Then placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in season's only completed decathlon, the Goodwill Games. Tom won the 2002 indoor USATF heptathlon title and outdoor title, after getting a PR with 2<sup>nd</sup> place effort at Gotzis, 8583,

Brother Paul (U of Oregon) scored 7303 in '97, and younger brother Billy (7745) make the Pappi the highest scoring family in American history (ave 7953). Tom and Billy took over the brother-brother world lead in mid '03, with 16,529 points.

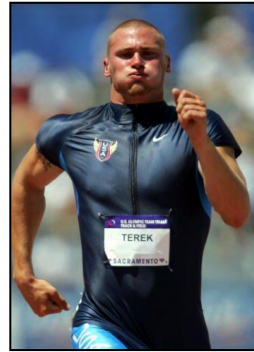
