WILLIAMS IS COLLEGE CHAMP

Charles, Daniels Win D-II and D-III Crowns

Hello Again..... Stanford senior Harrison Williams (Memphis, TN) gave himself a 23rd birthday present (Thursday, March 7) with a win at the NCAA I heptathlon in Birmingham's CrossPlex. Sixth after the break, he took over the lead from Arkansas's Gabe Moore during the vault and then expanded the margin by 4 seconds in the 1k for the win. His 6042 final tally was a 72 point PR.

As a matter of fact the top four finishers were American athletes, the first time that had happened since 2007. Moore (23, Freeport, FL) at 5975, Michigan State's Nick Guerrant (22, Portage, MI) at 5944 and Nebraska's Jared Seay (23, Akeny, IA) all recorded lifetime best scores. Estonian soph Johannes Erm/Georgia dropped one place and 171 points from his 2018 finish. USC's super frosh Ayden Owens (18, Wexford, PA) demonstrated eye-opening speed (6.75, 7.84), managed 3 vault PRs and put up 6 lifetime bests in 7 events. He was 6th at 5809.

The Williams/Moore battles which date to junior competitions (they were 1-2 at 2014 USA juniors and 6-8 st IAAF world juniors) have the potential to become standards for CEs.

Wichita State senior Ben Johnson suffered a groin injury on day two but his limping efforts in the vault and 1k were nothing less than heroic.
